- **Special Residency Permit (SRC):** A unique 10-year permit designed primarily for individuals of Armenian descent and foreign nationals who have demonstrated significant commitment to Armenia.

Routes to Residency: Criteria and Validity Periods

Residence by Investment Opportunities

After maintaining residency for three years, individuals become eligible to apply for Armenian citizenship.

Path to Residency and the Application Process

Investors can access residency through a streamlined application process. Here's how it works:

1. **Invest and Register:** Make your investment in a qualifying business and register as a shareholder.
2. **Schedule Your Appointment:** Book an appointment for application submission through the Migration and Citizenship Service website.
3. **Submit Your Application:** Gather necessary documents, including your passport and medical certificate, and submit them either in person or via a power of attorney if you are not in Armenia.
4. **Receive Your Residence Permit:** Applications are processed within 2-3 months, after which you must register your address and obtain a social security number.

Residence Through Employment

Foreign nationals seeking to live and work in Armenia must apply for a work permit, which also serves as a temporary residence permit valid for one year and can be renewed annually. This combined permit allows foreign nationals to legally reside and work in Armenia during this period. Meanwhile, nationals of EAEU countries are exempt from work permit requirements.

Step-by-Step Application Process

1. **Employer Registers on the Platform:** The employer registers on the Migration and Citizenship Service's online platform.
2. **Employer Initiates Application:** Once registered, the employer can begin the application by submitting required documents for the employee. The documents include: employee's passport, letter of commitment, relevant educational certificates (if applicable), etc.

3. **Decision on the Permit:** The Migration and Citizenship Service reviews the application, ensuring the job market assessment is met and documentation is complete. The standard processing time for a work permit is 2-3 months.

4. **Issuance of Work Permit:** Upon approval, the work permit combined with a temporary residence permit is issued, valid for one year.

Special Process for EAEU Citizens

For EAEU nationals, the process is simpler and does not require a formal work permit. Instead, they can independently apply for a certificate of legality of stay. Processing for the certificate of legality of stay is typically 1 to 2 months. This certificate acts as a temporary residency permit with a one-year validity.

Residence Through Education

Armenia provides a temporary residency option for international students enrolled in Armenian educational institutions, including primary, secondary, and higher education. This permit is issued for the duration of the study program, allowing students to stay in Armenia legally throughout their academic studies and renew it every academic year.

Step-by-Step Application Process

1. **Prepare Required Documents:** Gather the necessary documentation: valid passport, admission letter from the educational institution, enrollment contract, medical certificate, etc.
2. **Submit the Application:** Students can submit their applications directly to the Migration and Citizenship Service in Armenia.
3. **Await Approval:** The processing time for a temporary residence permit is typically 2-3 months.

Residence Through Business Activity

Foreign business owners, digital nomads, freelancers, and remote workers have several pathways to obtain residency in Armenia through business activity. This option is particularly flexible, with no minimum investment or income requirements, and it includes provisions for individuals running both local and online businesses.

Step-by-Step Application Process

1. **Register the Business in Armenia:** Before applying for a residence permit, register the business or business activity with the Armenian authorities, typically through the State Register for Legal Entities. Within 20 days of registration, the applicant should decide on an appropriate tax regime.
2. **Prepare Required Documents:** Required documents include: original passport, medical certificate, business registration documents.
3. **Submit the Application:** Applications can be submitted directly at the Migration and Citizenship Service in Armenia either by the applicant or through an authorized representative.
4. **Immigration Interview:** Typically, within 2-5 weeks after application submission, the applicant or their representative will participate in an interview with a National Security officer to verify the business's activity. The officer may ask about the following operational details; tax invoices and contracts, client and partner payment receipts, advertising materials, etc.
5. **Receive Residency Permit Approval:** Application processing generally takes 2-3 months. For renewals, updated proof of active business operations and tax compliance are required.

Residence Through Family Connection

Holders of Armenian residence permits have the option to bring immediate family members to reside in Armenia. Eligible family members include spouses, children, and parents. Additionally, holders of permanent or special residence permits may sponsor extended family members, such as siblings, grandparents, and grandchildren.

Step-by-Step Application Process

1. **Prepare Documentation:** Collect all required documents, including original passport, proof of family relationship, medical certificate, etc.
2. **Submit the Application:** Applications are submitted through the Migration and Citizenship Service, either in person or by an authorized representative.
3. **Receive Temporary Residency Approval:** After 2-3 months from the submission, family members will be issued a one-year temporary residence permit.

Renewal and Permanent Residency Eligibility

Initially, family members are limited to one-year temporary residence permits, which they must renew each year. Family members of special residency holders and citizens can become eligible for a five-year permanent residence permit after completing three years of continuous temporary residency, provided they meet the housing and income requirements.

Residence Through Ethnicity

Armenia offers a straightforward pathway to residency for individuals of Armenian descent, allowing them to obtain temporary, permanent, or special residency permits, or even Armenian citizenship, if they wish. However, specific formal requirements must be met to confirm Armenian ethnicity and qualify for residency under this route.

Accepted Proof of Armenian Ethnicity:

- **Baptism Certificate:** Issued by a recognized Armenian church organization, certifying the Armenian heritage of the applicant.
- **Government-Issued Documents:** Certain official documents, such as birth certificates or family records, may mention Armenian ethnicity and can be used to verify heritage.

The Armenian government maintains a list of approved church organizations whose baptism certificates are accepted for residency applications.

Step-by-Step Application Process

1. **Prepare the Required Documents:** Before starting the application, ensure you have the following documents ready: proof of Armenian ethnicity, valid passport, etc.
2. **Submit the Application:** Applications are submitted to the Migration and Citizenship Service. In case of applying for a special residency, the applicants may also choose to apply at the Armenian embassy or consulate abroad.
3. **Await Approval:** Processing times depend on the type of permit being applied for. For temporary and permanent residency applications based on Armenian ethnicity, processing generally takes up to 2-3 months. For a special residency application it may take about 3-4 months.

Residence Through Significant Activities

The special residency is primarily issued to foreign nationals of Armenian descent; however, in exceptional cases, non-Armenians involved in economic, cultural, or significant public activities in Armenia may also qualify.

Applicants should prepare the necessary documents, such as engagement in Armenian business or cultural activities and passport.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

1. What are the main requirements for the Armenian residency program?

To qualify for an Armenian residence permit, applicants must have a legitimate reason, such as employment, business ownership, family ties, or investment. Requirements may vary depending on the permit type
